Statement of Values and School Philosophy

- display posters and banners that promote our values in our school
- celebrate our values in our school communications
- provide awards and recognition for students who actively demonstrate the values
- discuss our values with students in the classroom, meetings, and assemblies.

Ballarat High School is a learning community where every person is valued, respected, and challenged as a learner.

SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY:

Ballarat High School is a learning community. We believe in all learners. Our learning framework guides our instructional practice and learning within our community. Personal growth, innovation and creativity are actively encouraged for all members of the school community.

Our values of Pride, Respect, and Responsibility ensure we build and maintain strong and positive relationships. Through personalised learning, we focus on teaching and learning strategies that will raise standards and outcomes for individuals. Through personalised learning and development, incorporating individual learning goals, we tailor education to ensure all students and staff achieve in a positive learning culture of high expectations and support.

STUDENT WELLBEING VISION:

At Ballarat High School we endeavour to provide an inclusive, positive, respectful learning environment for all students. We believe in educating the whole person and acknowledge the correlation between student wellbeing and connectedness and academic achievement. - organisation, management, goal setting and achievement
- modelling and encouragement of positive behaviours
- forward thinking, innovation, creativity, and flexibility
- Informed decision making

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS:

Ballarat High School acknowledges that the behaviour of staff, parents, carers, and students has an impact on our school community and culture.
