School Council is committed to providing the best possible learning opportunities for all our students.

Parent Contributions assist the School to provide an enriched learning and teaching program for every student and maintain its high standards in quality facilities. Parent contributions supplement Government grants and are crucial to our budget.

The Education and Training Reform Act 2006 provides for instruction in the standard curriculum program to be free to all students in government schools. Parent contributions supplement Government funding, and without your support we cannot provide the resources and programs you expect.

The Department of Education and Training has a Parent Payments Policy and Ballarat High School Council ensures compliance with this DET policy and associated guidelines, when undertaking their implementation and administration.

Schools are able to request payments from parents in the following categories:

- 1.0 Curriculum Contributions: Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the curriculum.
- 2.0 Extra-Curricular Items and Activities: Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the curriculum. These are provided on a user pays basis.
- 3.0 Other Contributions: Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the schools functions and objectives.

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CURRICULUM & SERVICE CHARGE—Curriculum Contribution—Voluntary

Parents are invited to pay a Curriculum and Service Charge for all students attending Ballarat High School.

The School Council, after careful consideration, determined that the 2022 Curriculum and Service Charge will be:

Year 7-12	\$410
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All funds collected from families for this Charge contribute directly to your child's educational experiences and for resources that have been deemed necessary for students to learn the curriculum.

In summary the funds are allocated to the following budget areas;

Given that students have individual learning plans, the exact class materials supplied will vary. Typically items such as: food for home economics, wood for woodwork, photocopying to create a workbook in lieu of a text/ practice exams, transport and venue hire for PE, stationery to supplement booklist requirements, etc.

Bring Your Own Device SUPPORT CHARGE—YEARS 7-12—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

The BYOD Support Charge of \$30, is payable for all students with an iPad/notebook at school. This covers the cost of initial on-site configuration of the device and connection to the BHS learning environment.

CAMPS, EXCURSIONS and TOURS—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Throughout 2022, specific year levels and subject areas will arrange camps, excursions and tours which enhance the school based learning. Parents will be provided with full details and costs prior to each activity. Full payment of these costs must be received by the School, prior to departure.

ARCH MAGAZINE—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Each year Ballarat High School produces a School magazine. This is available to any member of the School community for \$20. Orders close at the end of Term 3. Therefore all families/students wishing to receive a Magazine in 2022, must make the applicable payment by Friday 16th September 2022.

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INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC TUITION PROGRAM CHARGES—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Students who have elected to nominate and have been selected to participate in the Instrumental Music Program, will be required to pay the following charges in 2022:

SPECIALIST SPORT PROGRAM CHARGES—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Students who have elected to nominate and have been selected to participate in the Specialist Sport Program, will be required to pay the following charges in 2022:

Year 7	\$150 (Inc. shirt, shorts & socks)	Year 10	\$240 (Inc. VET, books and First Aid—TBC)
Year 8	\$120 (Inc. tracksuit pants)	Year 11	\$200 (Inc. VET and books—TBC)
Year 9	\$150 (Inc. jacket)	Year 12	no charge

ROWING PROGRAM CHARGES—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Students who opt to participate in the Rowing Program, will be required to pay the following charges for the 2021/2022 rowing season:

Year 9 Division Crews	\$190 plus regattas
Year 10 Division & 1000m Senior Crews	\$230 plus regattas
Senior Division 2000m Crews	\$290 plus regattas

Each crew may also have uniform, camp and/or excursion costs.

2022/2023 Rowing Season charges will be advised prior to the Season launch.

VET IN SCHOOLS PROGRAMS

Students electing to study a VETiS program generally require specialised curriculum resources, uniform items, etc. The total cost varies depending upon the program chosen.

The DET for 2022 will introduce a new system to lower the cost of VET materials fees to families. The exact details are still being finalised. We will publish each specific program information as soon as it becomes available.

OTHER CHARGES—Extra-Curricular Items & Activities

Other charges may be levied throughout the year to cover the cost of small excursions, sport education, etc. and as a contribution towards the cost of providing specialist materials.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Ballarat High School is fortunate to be supported by a number of corporate/service organisations and individuals, providing funds for student scholarships. A full list is available on our website. Eligible students are encouraged to apply.

The due dates listed above are required to be met to guarantee participation in the programs. Parents making payments via a payment plan will be given some flexibility.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Payments may be made using cash, cheque, VISA, MasterCard or EFTPOS via the General Office.

Credit card payments may be made over the telephone or in person.

BPay facilities are also available. These payments can be for all outstanding account items, specific charges or a regular scheduled payment plan. All Family Statements include BPay reference details. To ensure the correct allocation of payments by our Office staff, parents using this facility are kindly requested to send us an email indicating their allocation preferences. If we do not receive this advice within 3 working days of the payments being made, the funds will be allocated at our discretion.

Centrepay deductions can also be arranged. Centrepay is a direct bill-paying service offered to customers receiving payments from Centrelink, where regular amounts are deducted and paid to the School.

Camps, Sports and Excursion funds are available to eligible families who make an application.

We have recently introduced Compass Pay, allowing online permissions and payments for events etc.

Campion Education provide our booklist services and have kindly partnered with the school to also collect funds on our behalf. These funds are forwarded to us in February each year and receipted to parent accounts.
